So I was coming home from school and I stayed for basketball practice and we lived about a mile and a half from Hinesburg Village and the farmhouse was kind of up on a hill and it was just all lit up. The barns and the house. Every light was on and it was just a spectacular sight. And I'd run a little ways and then I'd cry. I was so excited, I can't talk about it. I was so excited about we had electricity. Couldn't believe it.
